

## In Egypt, US concerned about Zionist lobby

**Washington's stance regarding the crisis in Egypt is associated with its concerns about the Zionist lobby that puts pressure on American politicians, an analyst said.**

"The United States is interested in their own internal domestic politics. They really don't have any interests in recognizing what is the public opinion in Egypt," political commentator Edward Corrigan told Press TV's US Desk on Wednesday.

***"They're concerned about the Zionist lobby, which is not only the Organized Jewish Community, but also the Christian Zionists, who through money and organizations, [are] able to put pressure on American politicians and of course helping them be able to control the election process," he added.***

"Egypt's opinion from the American point of view has little bearing on internal politics of the United States, so they are quite prepared to sacrifice the Egyptian public opinion."

The analyst made the comments after US Senator Lindsey Graham expressed the Obama administration's concerns over the fallout of the latest turmoil in Egypt for the Israeli regime.

"If Egypt goes and Israel is surrounded by more and more radical regimes ... we'll regret not doing everything possible to keep Egypt on track as a stable society," Graham said on Tuesday signaling Washington's interference in Egypt's internal affairs.

President Barack Obama asked Senator Graham and Senator John McCain to travel to Egypt next week.

Egypt has been gripped by deadly violence since the military ousted Mohamed Morsi, the country's first democratically-elected president, on July 3. The White House has shied away from calling Morsi's ouster a military coup.

"The Americans actually gave sort of a green light to the overthrow of democratically elected Morsi leadership and the Muslim Brotherhood in Egypt," Corrigan said.

"The Americans are only interested in democracy they can control and they're happy with the outcomes," he added.
