

# MacDonald Bows Out of Ward 3 Race, Corrigan Jumps Into Ward 9 Contest

Bernie MacDonald is out, and Ed Corrigan is in.

Both former London City Councillors are making moves ahead of the upcoming municipal election with MacDonald dropping out of the race in Ward 3, citing family concerns. It's the second time in recent months the 28-year Council veteran has had a change of heart on whether to seek a return to 300 Dufferin.

Ed Corrigan (pictured), on the other hand, has committed to running in Ward 9.

"People have been urging me to consider running again, so I have decided today that I'm going to pick up the paper work and start the ball rolling, probably tomorrow I'll file the paper work, if not later today." he told AM980.

Corrigan previously served one term on Council from 2000 to 2003 before he was defeated by Paul Van Meerbergen.

He plans on running in Ward 9 which is currently represented by Dale Henderson — he has already he won't be seeking reelection in October.

"There's no incumbent, so I think the time is right to put my name back in again, to work and act on behalf of people in the Byron and Lambeth area." Corrigan said.

"When I was on Council, I was not particularly part of one faction.. I was sort of a moderate."

Corrigan joins four other candidates seeking the nomination in Ward 9.
